Millhill Child and Family Development Receives Grants for Medical Home Link Program

[Trenton, NJ] --- Millhill Child and Family Development Corporation has received major grants for its Medical Home Link. The Princeton Area Community Foundation has announced a \$15,000 grant in conjunction with a \$10,000 grant from the Piper Sutton Foundation. Millhill is one of 24 organizations to receive funding through the Community Foundation's Greater Mercer Grant Program. Grants totaling over \$470,000 were awarded to local nonprofits for a full range of community building, program, and operating support.

Steven K. Rosen, Executive Director of Millhill Child and Family Development, said the funds would be used to expand the number of children served, to purchase an audiometer, and for general program support. The Medical Home Link program provides developmental and medical screening and services for the critically underserved children in Millhill's toddler and preschool classrooms. The on-site neurodevelopmental pediatrician and pediatric nurse extensively examine, evaluate, and follow up with each affected child, few of whom would otherwise be able to afford these intensive assessments. Through coordination of findings with each child's family and clinician, and referral of families to appropriate specialists, Millhill Medical Home Link applies wide-ranging resources to break the cycles of medical and developmental neglect.
